After a long discussion, Peter stood up and said to the group, "Brothers, God chose me to tell the good news to the Gentiles. They heard the good news, and they believed. God accepted them and gave them the Holy Spirit, just as He did for us.

"We believe that the Jews and Gentiles are saved in the same way—by the grace of the Lord Jesus.


"I think we should not cause trouble for the Gentiles who have trusted in Jesus. Instead, let's write them a letter telling them the things they should not do."


